#### 1. Applied criteria


The summarized financial statements are derived from the audited financial statements, prepared in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations, as at March 31, 2024 and March 31, 2023 and for the years then ended.

The preparation of these summarized financial statements requires management to determine the information that needs to be reflected in them so that they are consistent in all material respects with, or represent a fair summary of, the audited financial statements.

Management prepared these summarized financial statements using the following criteria:

- (a) the summarized financial statements include a statement for each statement included in the audited financial statements except for the statement of cash flows, as it is deemed less relevant for the users of the summarized financial statements;
- (b) information in the summarized financial statements agrees with the related information in the audited financial statements;
- (c) major subtotals, totals and comparative information from the audited financial statements are included; and
- (d) the summarized financial statements contain the information from the audited financial statements dealing with matters having a pervasive or otherwise significant effect on the summarized financial statements.

#### THESE ARE THE PEOPLE YOU HELP

Your support helps people see better, walk better or live better. Thanks to you, Daymond Volk is doing all three.

In May of 2023, the Sun Life financial advisor was the recipient of a hip replacement. Months later he had eye surgery. Both procedures were at Saskatoon City Hospital.

Throughout, Daymond was amazed at, "how good the whole process was. I'd been on the list for the hip replacement for 17 months so was already coming to City Hospital for cortisone shots. On the day of the surgery, I was more amazed at how well-oiled it was."

He cites a heated smock and then the anaesthetist playing Johnny Cash to calm his nerves as reasons for his wonderful experience. "Every staff member was top notch. It was just so pleasant."

Three months later, Daymond was back at City Hospital. This time he was treated for pterygium, a wedge-shaped growth of the conjunctiva. "My optometrist discovered it. He said it could invade into the retina and cornea, so referred me to the Eye Care Centre."

As with the hip, the process and staff were excellent. "But I've had enough of City Hospital for a while," Volk jokes.

His experience with City Hospital really began much

sooner, he adds. "I was born there while the hospital was being renovated in 1960."

Sarah Buettner praised City
Hospital following a health
emergency. "I started not
feeling well," says the City
Park resident and executive
director of the Saskatoon Club.
"I have Behcet's disease, an
autoimmune disease, so I'm
cautious about my heatlh."

She was having chest pains and knew something was wrong. "It was Good Friday and no medical clinics were open. Because I live just across the street from City Hospital, I walked over to emergency.

"It was packed. I went to the admitting desk and told them about my chest pain and my autoimmune disease. They said have a seat but I didn't even get to a chair before a nurse came. She asked me to describe what has happening and immediately understood

doctor was there five minutes after. The ER doctor had never seen anyone with Behcet's but knew about it and what to do. He also called rheumatologists from other hospitals."

Sarah had a CT scan, ECG, x-rays, and other tests, all "within the first hour or so that I was there. They checked my vitals and put me on oxygen. It was like the staff knew what was happening before I did."

Buettner spent the rest of the day in the emergency room at City Hospital and was transferred that day to RUH. "But the City Hospital staff was so amazing. They had nurses stay with me the whole time because I needed an ambulance transfer."

She spent 7 nights at RUH but is so grateful that the staff at City Hospital reacted so quickly and correctly. "I feel very lucky that the ER was open and that the location was so convenient for me."
